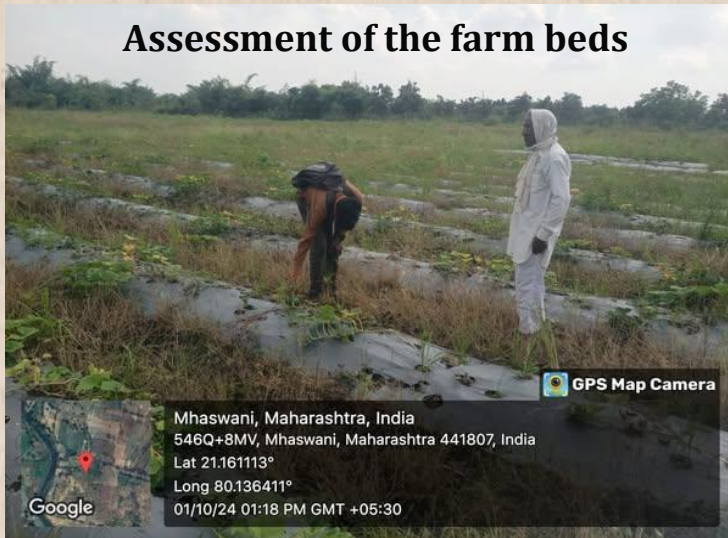

Workshop on Child Health & Hygiene. This workshop was focus on a lasting impact on child health and hygiene, leading to healthier children and more informed caregivers.



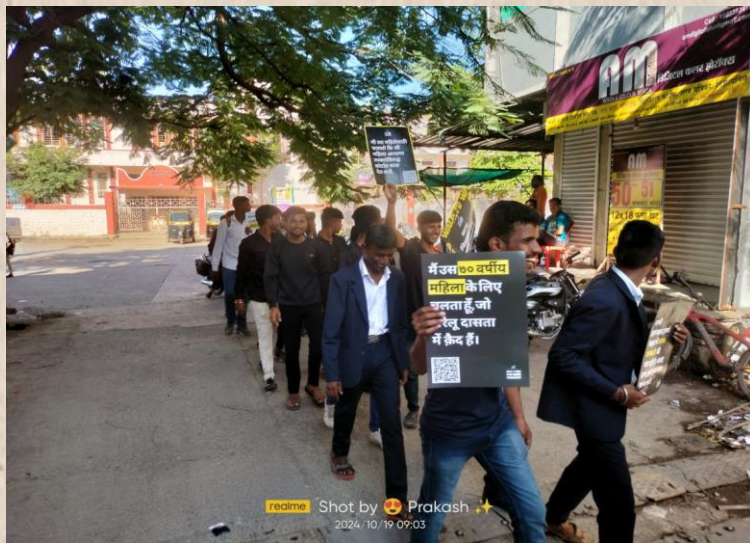
JAL HI JEEVAN – Installed 800 meters of pipeline, 138 tap connections, and the repair of a water tank promoted in the project village of Hingoli district.
